


Tatiana Wolska *Untitled*, 2021 Biro, gouache and watercolour on paper 40 x 29 cm TWD 2021




Tatiana Wolska *Untitled*, 2021 Biro on paper 40 x 29cm (framed: 47.5 x 35.5cm) TWD 2321










Tatiana Wolska *Untitled*, 2021 Biro, gouache and watercolour on paper 28 x 21 cm TWD 1321

The openness to potential extends to Wolska's daily drawing practice. 'Every morning', she says, 'I get up at 6am and it's coffee and drawing for an hour and a half before my kids get up.' This allows her to 'warm up the hands', both right and left, and to draw curved forms, which, if not perfect circles are nearly always shapes that cycle back into themselves: another expression of Wolska's impetus to revisit materials and forms to create them anew. Drawing, for Wolska, is an absorbing practice that leaves no space for thinking: 'my need is to draw, not to think about drawing.' The fluid nets, grids and sheaths she generates are reminiscent of skin, intestines, ligaments and muscles, yet they are not representations of anatomical elements or organs. This freedom from specific referents allows Wolska to follow her intuition until she reaches the point of 'appetising surprise', in which potential teeters on the edge of definition.

Wolska's creations show intrepid fungal strength; expansive potential to thrive, to burgeon. Wolska's drawings are vertiginous; their graphic forms and dynamic marks seem unmoored from human measures of scale or stable viewing points. Each of the diverse forms has the potential for multiple becomings. They could be topographies charting posthuman worlds: re-wilded mountains, desolate ravines, deep oceans. They suggest immersive close-ups of out-of-control organic undergrowth, mouldy rhizomatic overgrowth. They might be under-the-microscopic visions of mutating cells and viruses. The fine stratifications, hatchings in pen and ink, the luminous, overlapping washes of colour, indicate revved-up geology: fast-growing crystals or the seismic folding of tectonic plates. There is a further possibility that the high-tech sheen and supernatural vortices of the orifice shapes, present in her blue and red crayon drawings, mark thresholds to new virtual worlds of unstoppable, digital replication. ~ Elizabeth Perrotte



Tatiana Wolska - Bio

Born in 1977 in Zawiercie, (PL), Tatiana Wolska lives and works in Brussels (BE). In 2007 she graduated from École Nationale Supérieure d'Arts in Villa Arson, Nice. Describing herself a 'junk collector', Wolska uses discarded plastic bottles, salvaged timber, rusty nails and foam from old mattresses and 'gives them a new life'. She transforms these humble, discarded materials into seductive poetic, biomorphic sculptures. Drawing, which is a compulsive need for Wolska, is essential part of her practice

Wolska was awarded a prestigious Salon de Montrouge prize in 2014, which led to a solo presentation of her works at Palais de Tokyo in 2014 and 2015. Since then Wolska has been exhibited in numerous French and Belgian institutions such as Duchamp Art Center, Yvetot, Fondation Villa Datris, L'Isle-sur- la-Sorgue, Frac Centre-Val de Loire, Orléans, Les Tanneries, Amilly, Van Buuren Museum, Brussels, Fondation Boghossian, Brussels, Galerie de la Marine, Nice, FRAC Corse, FRAC PACA, Marseille.

In the last few years, with installations at Frac Corse in Corte (FR), Villa Empain in Brussels (BE) or Frac Centre-Val de Loire in Orléans (FR), Tatiana Wolska has expanded her creative process towards makeshift shelters and nomadic dwellings.

In 2021/2022 he sculptures have been presented at the Sculpture in the City in London and at Frieze Sculptures London.


TATIANA WOLSKA

NÉE EN 1977

fatiana Wolska est diplômée de l'école des Beaux-Arts de ce en 2007. Elle expose alors très vite son travail dans nombreuses expositions collectives et personnelles, en France, mais aussi à Bruxelles, en Corse et en Pologne pays d'origine), dans d'importantes galeries, fondations, centres d'art et musées. Lauréate en 2014 du grand prix du Salon d'art contemporain de Montrouge, elle est particulièrement remarquée, n France, en solo si (dès 2013), au Palais de Tokyo (en 2014), à la Galerie Papillon (dès 2015), chez Irène Laub (dès 2016) et, plus récemment, au centre d'art Les Tanneries (2019). De nature protéiforme, la pratique du dessin chez Tatiana Wolska est intimement liée à celle de la sculpture, les deux dialoguant de manière singulière. Économie de moyens, répétition et simplicité du geste sont essentiels dans son processus créateur qui nécessite beaucoup de temps et de patience. Il y a dans ses dessins une dimension organique qui renvoie au vivant, tant dans la forme que dans le geste de la main. Cette dimension replace la question du corps au centre des préoccupations et réinterroge la notion de réel, aux frontières de l'abstraction, de l'invisible et de l'intériorité. Par cet aspect-là, le dessin de Tatiana Wolska est représentatif d'enjeux contemporains qui ont marqué l'art de notre époque et que l'on retrouve partagés par d'autres artistes de sa génération.







